In recognition of increasing globalization in all sectors of world society, the College of Health and Human Services International Experience has been established. Students participate in residence for two or more weeks in a designated non-Western region or country in Asia, Africa, Central and South America. The purpose of the experience is to increase student awareness of cross-cultural issues, global health, and to explore economic, political, cultural, social services, and health challenges experienced by the local population. LOWER DIVISION COURSES

HHS 280. Health Education for Teachers (1)

Prerequisite: For multiple or single subject teacher candidates.
Topics designated in health framework for California; infusing health topics in the K-12 general curriculum.

UPPER DIVISION COURSE (Intended for Undergraduates)

HHS 350. Applied International Health and Human Services (3) [GE]

Prerequisite: Completion of the General Education requirement in Foundations of Learning II.B. Social and Behavioral Sciences.

Examine economic, political, cultural, environmental, health and human services challenges, and variations with respect to disease, mental health, and poverty in a designated non-Western region or country in Asia, Africa, Central and South America.
